



# Dear Parishioners...

Palm Sunday is also called Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. Two different names for the same reality. This Sunday begins with a party atmosphere. We remember, making a festive procession, the triumphant entry of Jesus in Jerusalem. For once, Jesus is acclaimed by His town people. He is recognized as the new David, the king who all expected. Of course, His entrance is not like that of a king of that time. He enters riding on a donkey, which was not exactly the way of the kings. Those who acclaimed him were part of the lower class of the town. Surely there were not many priests or scribes among them. The priests and the scribes were most likely thinking how to get rid of him. Therefore, the triumph and the cross begin to mix. In the same way, the liturgy joins those two realities on this day.

With the procession we pass into the mass and, in this, the readings place us in front of Jesus' death and His significance. Jesus is the one who surrenders himself to death to fulfill the will of God, His Father, and totally trusts him at the time of His final delivery, as the prophet Isaiah says in the first reading. Jesus, is the same God who delivers his life for us, who does not boast his category of God, who submits himself even to death. And it is through that delivery that He is going to become a sign of salvation for all. "Before him, all knees will bend," as Saint Paul says in the second reading.

Let's start in this manner this Holy Week. This is the large gateway in which we place ourselves: in Jesus, the greater triumph is the moment of his death. What for human eyes is the maximum pain, the greatest act without sense, for God is the opportunity to proclaim His love for all men in the most solemn way possible. We no longer know what part is the most triumphant, if its His entrance on a donkey into Jerusalem while the poor shout and shake branches of olive trees, or the moment of the cross, in which alone, abandoned by His people, signs with His own blood that all his life, he only wanted to be at the service of the Kingdom of God, He wanted to be a living testimony of his love for men and women and that his delivery is so that we all have life and a life in abundance.

There is only one pending question: Where are we all in this story? Jesus handed himself for us, for each one of us. When we gaze up and we see Him, riding a donkey or bearing the cross, we find the same thing: His eyes look at us and tell us that He gives everything so we can be happy, for us to live, so that we love each other. At least during this week, let us be very aware and remain close to Jesus. It is not necessary to say many words. In silence but close to Him. Without distracting ourselves in the superficial details. Simply, letting Him arrive in our hearts, with the deepness of His love, of his delivery for us. So that we have life and life in abundance.

# Estimados feligreses...

El Domingo de Ramos es llamado también el Domingo de Pasión. Dos nombres diferentes para una misma realidad. Porque este domingo comienza con un ambiente de fiesta. Recordamos, haciendo incluso una procesión, la entrada triunfal de Jesús en Jerusalén. Por una vez, Jesús es aclamado por su pueblo. Se le reconoce como el nuevo David, el rey que todos esperaban. Claro que su entrada no es como la de un rey de los de la época. Su montura es un borrico, que no era exactamente la montura de los reyes. Los que le aclamaban formaban parte del pueblo humilde. Seguro que no había muchos sacerdotes ni escribas entre ellos. Los sacerdotes y los escribas estarían más bien pensando en como librarse de él. Así que el triunfo y la cruz se comienzan ya a mezclar. Del mismo modo que la liturgia une esas dos realidades en este día.

Porque de la procesión pasamos a la misa y, en ésta, las lecturas nos sitúan frente a la muerte de Jesús y su significado. Jesús es el que se entrega a sí mismo a la muerte para cumplir la voluntad de Dios, su Padre, y confía totalmente en él a la hora de su entrega final, como dice el profeta Isaías en la primera lectura. Jesús, es el mismo Dios que entrega su vida por nosotros, que no hace alarde su categoría de Dios, que se somete incluso a la muerte. Y es a través de esa entrega como se va a convertir en signo de salvación para todos. "Ante él se doblará toda rodilla", como dice san Pablo en la segunda lectura.

Comenzamos así la Semana Santa. Éste es el pórtico grande en que nos situamos: en Jesús el triunfo mayor es el momento de su muerte. Lo que para nosotros es el máximo dolor, el mayor sin-sentido, para Dios es la oportunidad de proclamar su amor por todos los hombres de la forma más solemne posible. Ya no sabemos qué parte es la más triunfal, si su entrada sobre un borrico en Jerusalén mientras que unos pobres gritan y agitan ramas de olivo, o el momento de la cruz, en el que sólo, abandonado de todos los suyos, firma con su propia sangre que toda su vida ha querido estar al servicio del reino de Dios, ha querido ser un testimonio vivo de su amor por los hombres y mujeres y que su entrega es para que todos tengamos vida y vida en abundancia.

Sólo queda una pregunta pendiente: ¿Dónde estamos nosotros en toda esta historia? Porque Jesús está entregándose por nosotros, por cada uno de nosotros. Cuando levantamos la mirada y lo vemos, en el borrico o en la cruz, encontramos lo mismo: sus ojos nos miran y nos dicen que lo da todo para que seamos felices, para que vivamos, para que nos amemos. Al menos que durante esta semana, sepamos permanecer cerca de Jesús. No es necesario decir muchas palabras. En silencio pero cerca de Él. Sin distraernos en los detalles superficiales. Simplemente, dejando que llegue a nuestro corazón la hondura de su amor, de su entrega por nosotros. Para que tengamos vida y vida en abundancia.
