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Did you know?

Remember to keep instructions simple and age-appropriate, with empowering roles for children in managing their own safety at home. Be sure to show younger children how to access the security screen on a cell phone that allows them to call 911 without unlocking the phone. Dear Parishioners:

Does the story make sense? And human life? Watching things unfold on the real-life setting is chilling. We often feel weak and powerless. What to say? What to do? It is not easy. Neither is it for the believer in the God of Jesus. When it is bad, when we have bad: where is God? Is faith in a good and saving God compatible with misfortune, with evil, with the suffering of so many people and, above all, with that of innocent people?

The drama of these questions places us before the situation posed by the first reading in the person of Job. The wrong suffered unjustly leads him to question the meaning of things. His questions are those of any man haunted and besieged by pain. His difficulties are also ours. The Word of this Sunday is courageous and places us in front of the mystery of evil and its difficult relationship with faith in God.

What is interesting about the readings offered to us this Sunday is that they manifest the connection of that reality with the God of the incarnation and, as a consequence, with our ecclesial mission. In the Gospel, Jesus leaves the synagogue and heals all the people he meets on his way. The first is Simón's mother-in-law, who welcomes him into her house. Then to the crowds that flock to him ("he cured many sick of various ills and cast out many demons"). In this way, Jesus reveals to a God who does not want people to suffer any evil. It is relevant to underline that Jesus, before healing, comes from the encounter with God in the synagogue (in the Word) and, later, he retires alone to pray. What Jesus says or does to break the experience of the pain of the brothers springs from his relationship with God (with the Father). The authentic experience of God does not drive away from pain, but rather brings us closer.

Jesus, who is in prayer, says: "Let's go somewhere else to preach there too, that's why I've come." The mission of the Master of Nazareth is an open mission ... a universal mission because pain and evil, in whatever form, affect all men and women in the world.


Estimados Feligreses:

¿Tiene sentido la historia? ¿Y la vida humana? Contemplar el discurrir de las cosas en el escenario de la vida real produce escalofríos. Con frecuencia, nos sentimos débiles e impotentes. ¿Qué decir? ¿Qué hacer? No es sencillo. Tampoco lo es para el creyente en el Dios de Jesús. Cuando se pasa mal, cuando lo pasamos mal: ¿dónde está Dios? ¿es compatible la fe en un Dios bueno y salvador con la desgracia, con el mal, con el sufrimiento de tanta gente y, sobre todo, con el de personas inocentes?

El dramatismo de estas preguntas nos ubican ante la situación que plantea la primera lectura en la persona de Job. El mal padecido injustamente le lleva a cuestionarse el sentido de las cosas. Sus preguntas son las de cualquier hombre angustiado y asediado por el dolor. Sus dificultades son también las nuestras. La Palabra de este domingo es valiente y nos coloca frente al misterio del mal y su difícil relación con la fe en Dios.

Lo interesante de las lecturas que se nos ofrecen en este domingo es que manifiestan la conexión de esa realidad con el Dios de la encarnación y, como consecuencia, con nuestra misión eclesial. En el evangelio, Jesús sale de la sinagoga y sana a cuantas personas encuentra en su camino. La primera la suegra de Simón, que le acoge en su casa. Después a las multitudes que acuden a él ("curó a muchos enfermos de diversos males y expulsó muchos demonios"). De este modo, Jesús revela a un Dios que no quiere que la gente padezca mal alguno. Es relevante subrayar que Jesús, antes de curar, viene del encuentro con Dios en la sinagoga (en la Palabra) y, después, se retira a solas a orar. Lo que Jesús dice o hace para romper la experiencia del dolor de los hermanos brota de su relación con Dios (con el Padre). La auténtica experiencia de Dios no aleja, sino que acerca al mundo del dolor.

Jesús, que está en oración, dice: "Vámonos a otra parte para predicar también allí, que para eso he venido". La misión del Maestro de Nazaret es una misión abierta... una misión universal porque el dolor y el mal, en la forma que sea, afectan a todos los hombres y mujeres del mundo.
