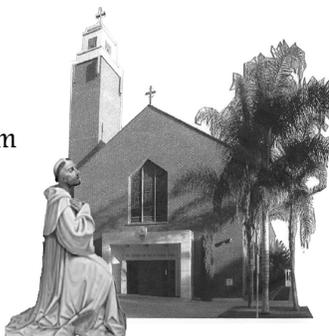

**Protect young people from cyber bullying**

Cyber bullying can happen at any time, on any online platform. It can take many forms – cruel direct messages, threatening emails, mean texts, shared photos, and more. Victims of cyber-bullying often suffer from anxiety and depression, and their self-esteem can be diminished. They may be reluctant to talk about bullying, so parents need to be on top of all their children's online activities. Asking questions and getting information about popular apps and sites will help, too.

**Dear parishioners:**

The first reading of this Sunday brings to our minds the story of the liberation from Egypt. There, the Israelites lived in slavery. But there came a time when the Lord saw the oppression of His people, listened to their complaints and freed them from this situation to take them to the promised land, a land that flows with milk and honey. He wants to do the same with us because we are his creatures. And he wants life for us, life in fullness, life in freedom. But what do we do with that liberation that God offers us?

The fact that God sets us free does not automatically grant us freedom. It is not enough for the prisoner to open the prison door. He has to get up and leave with his own feet. Or said with the words of Jesus: "If you do not convert, you will all perish." With the parable of the fig tree we can understand the immense mercy of God who keeps on extending his saving hand again and again. The owner had already spent three years spending time and money in a vineyard that did not bear fruit. He wants to cut it, tear it and occupy the ground in something else. But the vinedresser asked one more chance, thinking that it is still possible that it will bear fruit. It's a matter of patience and work. The same patience that God continues to have with us.

Lent is not the time to feel hopeless or discouraged. The readings of this Sunday are cause for hope. They confirm, once again, that God does not abandon his people.

**A LETTER TO MY GRANDMA:**

Dear Grandma. I am so sorry because of the priestly molestations. As Catholics, many (included my parishioners) voluntarily contribute money to the church. But I want to assure you that their contributions are not the means by which the church pays the lawsuits. I can guarantee to you that by contributing towards the church with your donations, you are not enabling the church to pay settlements.

The Catholic Church, especially in Los Angeles is doing many, many things to prevent this crime from happening again. It is doing everything in its power to assure that the victims' human rights are being respected. Dear Grandma do not stop making your contributions to the church. They are not a means for the Catholic Church to give the priestly criminals a free pass. Keep in mind that there are many, many wonderful priests dedicated to serving God and that those priests who have molested children have done so not because of priestly celibacy, but because they are molesters and pedophiles who would have molested even if they had been married men.

Receive my blessing in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Love you.

**Estimados feligreses:**

La primera lectura de este domingo nos trae a la memoria el relato de la liberación de Egipto. Allí los israelitas vivían en la esclavitud. Pero llega un momento en que el Señor ve la opresión del pueblo, escucha sus quejas y los libra de esa situación para llevarlos a la tierra prometida, una tierra que mana leche y miel. Con nosotros quiere hacer lo mismo porque somos sus criaturas. Y él quiere la vida para nosotros, la vida en plenitud, la vida en libertad. Pero, ¿qué hacemos con esa liberación que Dios nos ofrece?

El hecho de que Dios nos libere no nos alcanza automáticamente la libertad. Al preso no basta con abrirle la puerta de la cárcel. Tiene que levantarse y salir por su propio pie. O dicho con las palabras de Jesús: "Si no os convertís, todos pereceréis". Con la parábola de la higuera podemos comprender la inmensa misericordia de Dios que una y otra vez sigue tendiendo su mano salvadora. El dueño llevaba ya tres años gastando tiempo y dinero en una viña que no daba fruto. Quiere cortarla, arrancarla y ocupar el terreno en otra cosa. Pero el viñador quiere seguir probando. Piensa que todavía es posible que dé fruto. Es cuestión de paciencia y trabajo. La misma paciencia que Dios sigue teniendo con nosotros. Hasta que seamos capaces de vivir como hombres y mujeres libres y responsables.

Cuaresma no es tiempo para sentirnos desesperanzados o desanimados. Las lecturas de este domingo son causa de esperanza. Nos confirman, una vez más, que Dios no abandona a su pueblo.

**Querida tía Tota.**

Siento mucho los abusos sexuales perpetrados por sacerdotes. Como católicos, muchos (incluidos mis feligreses) contribuyen voluntariamente con dinero a la iglesia.
